Chester County's newest industry emphasizes community with its slogan: "Our world, our company . . . let us work for our own and everyone's prosperity." With one of the world's most advanced exhaust manufacturing facilities and body stamping processes, Arvin Sango Inc. (ASI) has a first priority of customer satisfaction. The company strives to ask, "How can we make this better?" every day. Arvin Sango boasts a world of innovation at work that begins with the drive and determination of its members to safely build the most technologically advanced, highest quality, original equipment automotive assemblies.

Arvin Sango is a main supplier to Toyota and also supplies to Nissan. The company decided to come to Chester County in 2008, in conjunction with the opening of a new Toyota Motor Manufacturing facility in Blue Springs, Miss. After visiting more than 20 cities, Arvin Sango chose Chester County for its next manufacturing location.

Scott Hubbard, Vice President of ASI Operations said the initial look at Chester County was due to its location on Highway 45. The decision to locate in Chester County, however, came after many positive encounters with city

officials and residents. "The city government and local chamber were by far the most helpful and friendly of everywhere we visited. They gave the impression that they would do anything to make us feel welcome here. They were really the hard sell for the city," said Hubbard.

With headquarters based in the small town of Madison, Ind., Arvin Sango gravitates toward rural areas, where residents tend to have strong work ethics. "We think the work ethics here and in Madison are very good. People like to come to work and put in a fair day's work," Hubbard explained.

Hubbard described more about the process that led to locating in Chester County. He said, "We looked at Jackson; it's a great city but Henderson had a more community feel, and everything you need is here or just 20 minutes away. Henderson has a good feel. You've got the college, so there's a little more going on than just a small town, and all the people are extremely nice and helpful." According to Hubbard, "Former Mayor Eddy Patterson even told us if he needed to bulldoze this hill himself in order for us to come here, then he would. Everything about Chester County has been a pleasant experience." "Henderson has a good feel. Site construction was begun in mid-September 2010. Actual building construction took place from November through early summer. "At the beginning of May we began moving equipment into the building and doing trials and actual production of parts. Shipping to Toyota-Mississippi began in fall of this year," said Hubbard.

Arvin Sango conducted a broad, extensive search for the plant manager but all other positions were advertised for and hired in the surrounding area. "We advertised locally and plenty of good applicants replied. We've been really pleased with the quality of people we've been able to hire."

Arvin Sango plans to grow the facility in Chester County as Toyota-Mississippi grows. Hubbard said, "We are investigating opportunities to expand in a three- to five-year period. There's nothing set in stone yet but there is a good possibility that we will continue to expand the plant here," said Hubbard. "The initial number of jobs in the facility is 20 but our goal in three years is to be in the 50 or 60 range. Most of the jobs are local and regional. We always hope for mostly local applications but we don't discriminate against anyone. After all, if they come from afar, they can move here." While Arvin Sango originally was looking for a location to which employees would be happy to relocate, they have been able to hire many people from within the region.

Hubbard has high hopes for the plant's new location as well as for for Arvin Sango's employees living here. "In Chester County, the people we talked to were nothing but great to work with so that gives us a feel for what the community is going to be like overall. We thought it was a community where our employees would like to live."

Prevent Manufacturing

The leading supplier of fabricated wire products for the heating, ventilating and air conditioning industry, Premier Manufacturing Corporation has called Henderson its home for the last 16 years. Initially built in 1995 to serve the needs of a carrier plant in Collierville, Tenn., the 150,000-square-foot state-of-the-art plant produces wire protective fan guards and inlet drills for central air conditioning units. Premier Manufacturing encompasses strong operating philosophies, including being the low-cost producer in the markets they serve and always operating with integrity. Quality is viewed as a never-ending process and journey at Premier Manufacturing.

In the Henderson location, products that are produced include fan guards, coil guards and grilles, motor mounts and wire forms. They also have the capabilities and manufacturing experience to fabricate an assortment of other products to fit special heavy machinery. The processes involved in the manufacture of the products such as straightening, cutting, stamping, resistant welding and polyester coating are all controlled by complete inhouse capabilities.

For Plant Manager Danny Tacker, the past decade here in Henderson has been a welcomed change for him and his wife. Their favorite thing about Chester County is the people who live here. "My wife and I have been here 11 years, and it's a warm, welcoming, friendly community," said Tacker. He enjoys the close-knit neighborhood life and the fact that everybody works together on projects for the betterment of the community. "It's just a nice environment."

The small, hometown feel of Henderson and Chester County is something Danny Tacker really loves. He pointed out that the small size is great and the proximity to Jackson and larger areas like Memphis is a big convenience. What makes Chester County unique to the Tackers is the way the people of the town look out for each other. "The main thing is the people of this

community are very caring and look to take care of their own. When there are problems or disasters, everybody pulls together," said Tacker.

> Not only is Chester County doing good things for the plant and its employees, but also the plant has done



and will continue to do good things for the residents of Chester County. In its first year, there were almost 70 jobs added. Since the recession, Premier Manufacturing has been able to call back more than 100 people to work at the Henderson plant. They have expanded their production area and have converted storage to more areas for production. With the national unemployment rates that exist, it is especially important that Premier has been able to provide so many with jobs.

When Premier Manufacturing corporate office realized they would have to shut down a plant, staff members looked at the performance and profitability of each plant to make the difficult decision. It is a testimony to the quality of work in Henderson that it was chosen to remain open. The Premier Manufacturing plant in Cleveland, Ohio is currently in the process of closing down and that work will be moved to Tennessee and a few plants in Mexico.

Besides the small-town feel, another appealing attribute to the Tackers and the plant's employees is the quality of life that Chester County provides. "It is a safe community with a great education system. We really fell in love with it when we got here. We came from middle Tennessee, and we are going to stay here until I retire. I really don't believe you could pull us out here now," said Tacker.

HILTON'S JACKS CREEK BBQ:

Just seven miles east of Henderson, this area has been home to great West Tennessee barbeque for more than a century. This unpretentious spot has been featured in *Southern Living* magazine and has served traditional Chester County barbeque as long as locals can remember.

SILER'S OLD TIME BBQ:

6060 State Route 100 E in Henderson

True to its name, Siler's Old Time BBQ cooks whole-hog pit barbeque the old-fashioned way. Local legend is that barbeque has been cooked at this location for more than 150 years. Siler's uses sorghum molasses in place of corn syrup. Siler's is one of the few who persistently insist on whole hog barbeque. Open Wednesday through Saturday, the restaurant is "open while the hog is on and closed when the hog is gone."

HENDERSON CEMETERY:

Church Street in Henderson

Many names that are important in City of Henderson history are represented in this cemetery. Dr. J.D. Smith, Sr., who is credited with developing the city of Henderson in 1871, is one of them. The Henderson Cemetary is the final resting place for many veterans. N.B. Hardeman, for whom Freed-Hardeman is named, and Hubert T. McGee, who was the architect of the Pink Palace in Memphis, Tenn., are buried there, also.

HISTORIC FRONT STREET:

Downtown Henderson Alive and well with shops like LaVon's Timeless Treasures, Happy Kids Consignment Shop and Robertson's



Trading Post, it's hard for visitors to miss historic Front Street on their way through Henderson. Originally a railroad stop in the 1850s, this small town operated a major recruitment center in the current Front Street area during the Civil War. It was the site of a Mobile & Ohio Railroad station and also home to Henderson's first business in the 1800s.

FREED-HARDEMAN UNIVERSITY/ ROLAND HISTORICAL ROOM:

158 East Main St. in Henderson

Freed-Hardeman University is a private liberal arts university, associated with the Churches of Christ since 1923. Home to more than 2,000 students from 31 states and 21 foreign countries today, it was a strong producer of teachers, preachers, businessmen and others during the Reconstruction Era. "Teaching how to live and make a living" is the motto of FHU, named for A.G. Freed and N.B. Hardeman in 1919. The Roland Historical Room of Freed-Hardeman University contains nearly 30,000 objects and 500 feet of documents covering 140 years of history. It is located in the Old Main building and is open Monday through Friday or by appointment.



THE HAMLETT-SMITH HOUSE:

Private Residence in Luray

This Greek-style home built in 1867 by Joel F. and Forina Hamlett from material found on their cotton plantation is located on Smith Road. Owned from 1908 to 1990 by Martha Eliza Smith, the Hamlett-Smith house has seen a great variety of visitors, including President Franklin D. Roosevelt and his wife Eleanor.

STILLWATERS FARM:

TO THE COUNTY'S LARGEST FAMILY PICNIC

"Just take a drive around our community any day of the week, and the enticing smell of open pit barbeque will help you understand why Chester County is the self-proclaimed "barbeque capital of the world."

Whole hog barbeques have been a Chester County tradition from the 1800s to now. Local residents created an event to honor this heritage and culture when they hosted an inaugural fundraiser on Thursday, June 22, 1978. This was the beginning of the Chester County Barebeque Festival.

The first fun-filled festival Saturday was kicked off with the Old Timers' Parade with old wagons, antique cars and horses, while downtown merchants took their goods to the sidewalks for an all-day sidewalk sale. Saturday night featured an old-fashioned street dance on the parking lot directly behind the courthouse. There were activities for the younger generation including a hog-calling contest, greased pig contest, relays and games at the Chester County Fairgrounds. Another interesting feature of the first Barbeque Festival was a tour guided by John Pusser (brother of Sheriff Buford Pusser) of the locations included in the filming of the 1972 movie *Walking Tall*.

Today the Chester County Barbeque Festival welcomes more than 10,000 visitors each year on the first weekend in October. With main activities still centered around the historic courthouse and Main Street, guests can enjoy entertainment as they set up their lawn chairs in the shadow of the beautiful Chester County Courthouse.

This festival is made possible because of the hundreds of volunteers who work together for three days to be a part of Chester County's largest event. There is no admission fee to the festival because local businesses and supporters make the event possible through partnerships.

For visitors from outside the region, university students and other guests, the festival is about barbeque, fried treats and entertainment. To many local residents, it represents memories, tradition and the strong spirit of community that Chester County has. Planners invite you to share famous barbeque and the community spirit that surrounds the entire event. We'll see you this fall on the

Who would have foreseen the unfulfilled need for a softball and baseball training facility in Chester County? Tom Batchellor, also known as "Old Man," did. Batchellor not only saw this need but also quickly

satisfied the market in Henderson and the surrounding area with his training facility, Simply Fastpitch.

Simply Fastpitch offers top quality instruction to players at all levels, as well as facility rentals for team practices, parties and more.

> Since his move from Florida just a little over a year ago, Batchellor has quickly set the standard for softball training around the county. Starting with just a few pitching alleys, he currently is working to fulfill not only softball needs but also recreational needs in general for Chester County. "They just don't have any other places to go. Other teams have to share the high school gymnasium.

There is a need for recreation that we hope to fill," said Batchellor.

Initially, Batchellor and his wife came to Chester County because his daughter and her husband had already built a house here. Batchellor had a background in construction; he came up to help them and fell in love. "I am so happy here it is unreal. I love to work with kids. Initially we were going to be smaller and live closer to south Jackson but one thing led to another and here we are. I love it here and that's all I can tell you," said Batchellor.

Batchellor and his partner started work at Simply Fastpitch in June 2010, opening in July while construction was still going on. By November, they were already expanding. They'd like to soon be able to expand even further out of their building and triple the size of their field. That would allow them to host more than one large team at a time, in addition to members, lessons and batting cage users.

Batchellor says the best part about living in Chester County is by far the people. "I lived in Florida for 47 years. After just a few months here, when I go into a store I see more people that I know; people here really stop and talk to you. I've only been here a little over a year and I have some great friendships. It blows me away," said Batchellor.

At Simply Fastpitch, players are trained to hit, field and pitch. Batchellor stresses the importance of fundamentals. He explained, "Many of coaches and teams don't have time to field 250 balls each practice with each player, so that's a need that we are trying to fill."

Batchellor is a strong believer in goals and numbers for the players — numbers like how fast they can pitch, how fast they can bat and even how many revolutions the ball makes. "The number is for you so you can set a goal, not for competition. I'm trying to encourage them and give them feedback from the physical to the brain," said Batchellor.

A goal of his own is to soon start hosting coaching clinics. "They are the most important of all. The reality is that money is better spent on doing intensive training with the coaches because they will retain it and pass it on to players for years to come," said Batchellor. "I had a guy come in last Saturday who has volunteered to coach for his daughter's team because they didn't have one. He is coming back to learn how to teach them. That's what we want to do. I would love to someday be able to ride around and see much good coming from this work and these practices."

With 20 years of experience under his belt, plans of expansion and growing friendships, Tom Batchellor, his family and Simply Fastpitch have found their place in Chester County. "More than anything else, I'm retiring and going to heaven," said Batchellor. Simply Fastpitch is located at 219 Appel Street in Henderson. Pitoni is quick to point out that she believes the benefits of living in Chester County far outweigh the costs of moving the farm. "We think Chester County's small-town charm and its unspoiled vistas make it so unique. Development and commercialism have yet to spoil it," she said.

The Pitonis also love to hear stories from their friend and local attorney, John Talbott. "He's an exceptionally talented storyteller on par with Garrison Keillor! Our favorite Chester County stories are just about anything told by him."

The small-town atmosphere with the convenience of a Jackson-sized city right down the road is another advantage for Stillwaters Farm's location. "With Jackson close by and Memphis within two hours, you are still at a convenient enough distance to have everything you need but you don't have to deal with all the negatives of that type of life such as the urban sprawl, crime, congestion and pollution," Pitoni added.

Providing a break from the busy city life or a place to rest, relax and be restored, Stillwaters Farm and Cottage is owned by Valeria Barton Pitoni and her husband, Rich. This farm offers a unique weekend getaway or an afternoon visit to spend some time away from technological distractions.

Pitoni and the farm came to Henderson five years ago from the small town of Titusville, Fla. about 45 minutes east of Orlando on the coast. They came with no friends, no family and without knowing anything about the land or layout here. She explained, "We felt like we were picked up from east central Florida and

Agritourism is a major focus of Stillwaters Farm. Not to be confused with agritainment which is more like corn mazes and harvest festivals with lots of crowds, agritourism is about education about agriculture. "What we try to do here is to keep things at a very minimum. We try to keep a very peaceful atmosphere. We educate visitors about agriculture, farm animals, farm life and try to give them a place to rest, relax and be restored," she said. Pitoni's husband operates his own business from home, Florida Hand Piece Repair/Tennessee Hand Piece, and it supports all of the endeavors at the farm. Pitoni stated, "It's a place that fosters a simple life, lived simply."

Another unique factor about Chester County that Pitoni has noted is the amount of agriculture found here. "Chester County is one of the few places that I have personally seen that is extremely agriculturally based and centered. Most other places, agriculture is an afterthought or passing way of life. Here in Chester County it seems to be alive and well," she said. "It's much like old Florida — it's personal and comfortable." She also expresses the great advantages in the quality of life here in Chester County such as the lower cost of living, less crime, elbowroom, four seasons and of course, all the nice, sweet and helpful people who live here.

Once a year, Stillwaters Farm hosts an open house. It is generally in the late fall to early winter and provides a time for the community to come out and check out the farm. There are local vendors that come and set up inside the cottage. It's a perfect time for Christmas shopping as well.

Pitoni sells her own homemade soaps and soy candles, as well as some of her personal art and photography of farm life. Those items were selected to promote agriculature in Chester County. "We chose soy candles because there are a lot of soy farmers here. We use a lot of cotton products because there are plenty of cotton farmers here, as well. Through the products that we make, the photographs I take and the art I create, we try to emphasize that agriculture plays a very important role in all of our lives, whether we realize it or not," she explained.

Stillwaters Farm is located at 375 Oak Grove Lane in Henderson. Guests can make an appointment to spend some time on the farm and can even make a reservation to spend a few nights at the cottage on the farm. The cottage boasts no wireless access and a home-away-from-home atmosphere, so visitors have a chance to disconnect, rest, relax and be restored.
