

Henderson Farmers Market is a Friday morning ritual for residents who want to buy fresh and stay close to home. Since the ribbon cutting ceremony May 26, a line of cars is often outside of the pavilion located at 455 N. Church Ave. Chester County residents have longed for a local farmers market since the pavilion was built several years ago.

"We built the pavilion through a grant, but Steve Rickman's passion and work made it take off," Henderson Mayor Bobby King said.

The farmers market is one of the first projects University of Tennessee Agriculture Extension Agent Steve Rickman tackled a few months into his new role.

"I wanted to know how we could make a market work," Rickman said. "I went to city meetings, talked to vendors and raised money for advertising, and the city supported it." In the two months since the market opened, vendor participation and customers have increased — averaging 1,000 to 1,100 customers and growing from 13 to 25 vendors.

A variety of vendors give shoppers options, including fresh Gulf shrimp, pork, chicken, beef, strawberries, sweet corn, tomatoes and baked goods.

"We've had everything from honey vendors, who sold out early, to Ruxbee's homemade ice cream," Rickman said. "We had a group come from Selmer just to buy the ice cream."

Chester County High School student Sam Phillips and his mom, Gaye, sold Friendship Bread at the Henderson Market in July. "He's doing it all, buying the ingredients and we work together to make it," Gaye Phillips said. They've sold about 40 loaves a week. Sam Phillips is raising money to buy a four-wheeler. "I know I have to work to get the things I want," he said. TN-GO Meats, of Milledgeville, has been a vendor at the Henderson Farmers Market since its opening day May 26. "Steve's done a phenomenal job putting this market together," Owner Sabra Schmidt said. "Some days we do better in Henderson than we do in Jackson."

The market's customers are from Chester and neighboring counties. Rebecca McLaughlin, of Bethel Springs, shops regularly at Henderson Farmers Market.


"I'm usually looking for fresh eggs, green beans and tomatoes," she said. McLaughlin was drawn to the market after seeing advertisements. "I rarely go to other markets, since this is so close."

Mary Duke, of Lexington, stopped by the market in July after hearing about it.

"It's nice, and I think they've done a good job," she said. "I know Henderson wanted a market before, so I'm glad they have one now." Duke is a gardener and is considering becoming a vendor next year.

The Farmers Market is open from 7 a.m. until 2 p.m. Fridays and will remain open through October and possibly once a month in November and December. "There are so many ideas we want to try, like a Friday night market from 4 until 8 p.m. with entertainment," Rickman said. "We also want to do something educational involving the schools."



State Recognition/LOCAL IMPACI

At the heart of any strong educational system are the teachers who give their best to students each day. They make the most of the time that they have by not only imparting knowledge but also loving their students. The Chester County School District is full of teachers who are committed to that mission.

"Two years ago, I had a student who would never return a hug or an 'I love you' when leaving school each day," Hayley Cloud, Chester County teacher, said. "At the beginning of the school year, this student in particular would simply walk past me and ignore me as I went through this afternoon routine. By December, she began to return a hug and whisper 'I love you too' in my ear. However, she didn't want her classmates to hear her say it. By March, the little girl would hug me as tight as she could and give me a big 'I love you' just as loud and proud as she could. That moment made me a better teacher because it helped me see that relationships are everything."

Cloud is this year's Regional Teacher of the Year for grades Pre-K to fourth grade. This award is a part of the Tennessee Teacher of the Year program held by the state each year.

She has taught in Chester County for six years and is yet another example of the county's commitment to excellence in education.

"Hayley Cloud is one of the Chester County teachers who provides the evidence for the public respect of our school district considered as one of the best in the state. Hayley has been at West Chester Elementary School as a third-grade teacher since 2012 and, in her short tenure, has developed into a highly effective teacher. Hayley has demonstrated multiple strengths of knowledge, use of curriculum and strong pedagogical strategies to engage her students in high levels of learning," said Superintendent Troy Kilzer II.

Chester County Director of Schools Troy Kilzer II is among eight finalists for Superintendent of the Year award on the state level. The winner of the competition, sponsored by the American Association of School Administrators, will move on to the national level.

"Being nominated by my colleagues is the honor," Kilzer said. "They understand the work you have in front of you."

Kilzer began his career in education as a math teacher and football coach before he became principal of Chester County High School. This is his fourth year as director of schools.

"I treat every opportunity as a learning experience, and I'm excited to have this honor coming out of my first term. I'll cherish it forever."

The Chester County School System has had teachers nominated for the Tennessee Teacher of the Year program for three consecutive years. Two years ago, Cathy Whitehead, from West Chester Elementary was named Teacher of the Year, and last year Christy McManus from Chester County Middle School was one of nine finalists for the award. Cloud, Whitehead and McManus each exhibit a strong commitment to their students and a passion for continued learning and professional growth, which are key ingredients for a healthy school system.

Chester County schools continue to thrive because of the people who are a part of them. The work of everyone from superintendent to student is what makes the Chester County School District great.

"Once you've worked the BBQ festival, I don't know why anyone would want to live anywhere else," he said.

Randy Crouse became a volunteer in the late 1980s. Casey and Crouse have spent countless hours in the BBQ pit together.

"We've worked all night and then all day," Crouse said. "When the festival moved from July to September, we were worried it would kill the festival, but it was the smartest move that we ever made."

The camaraderie among the volunteers keeps them returning year after year. "It's a lot of work and a lot of fun," Crouse said.



MAKING SIRIDES IN HEALTHY LIVING - GENE RECORD MEMORIAL PARK written by: tajuana cheshier

Try to keep up with all of the improvements around Gene Record Park, and you could literally break into a sweat.

This past spring frequent visitors likely noticed new exercise equipment — an elliptical machine, leg extension, a stationary bike and a two-person chair press — positioned along the walking trail in addition to a multi-colored bottle wall, new drinking fountain and new flower bed of lilies. On the north side of the park across from the soccer field, a sign announces the Chester T Dog Park area, set to break ground this fall. A new community feature that is also part of the effort to promote health and wellness in the community is the Henderson Farmers Market located next to the park.

All of the updates are a reflection of how community leaders are working to ensure Henderson and Chester County residents can live healthier lives — whether by starting a new exercise routine or choosing to purchase fresh fruit and vegetables from the local farmers market. Chester County's efforts to improve residents' quality of life earned the community a top spot in a recent health study. The county is ranked 11th out of 95 Tennessee counties for health outcomes, which measures longevity and how healthy people feel. The county health ranking study was released in late March and is conducted annually by the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute School of Medicine and Public Health.

OUTDOOR GYM

Just before the summer sun hit its peak in late July, Tauzzia Beatty was in the middle of her daily three-mile walk in Gene Record Park. Beatty has tried the park's new exercise equipment and affectionately refers to Gene Record as "my park." "I've used the equipment a few times, and it's easy," Beatty said. "There aren't too many parks where you can find gym equipment outside." Beatty often brings her sons to the park to play while she exercises.

New to exercising, Scott Coates has yet to try out the new equipment. "Someday, I will though," he said. "My health insurance through my job has this program called 'Choose To Move,' and I'm working on it," Coates said.

Henderson Park Director Dena Azevedo said the gym equipment has attracted users. "People feel free to use at their own pace and time," she said. "We also check the equipment regularly to make sure it's functioning properly." An average of 150 people visit the park daily, Azevedo said.

A \$10,000 Rural Access to Health and Healthy Built Environments from the Tennessee Department of Health helped to make the installation possible. Greenfields Outdoor Fitness equipment is secured in concrete and provides user instructions on the machines.

FINDING BEAUTY

Azevedo and her team work tirelessly on beautification projects. "I think the park has come a long way in four years," Azevedo said. "It has become a place for people across all generations to come together, meet or take photos."

Visitors will discover the park's new bottle wall along the walking trail, located in between the elliptical machine and the leg extension. It is a decorative and colorful display of glass bottles suspended in mid-air. A bed of lilies is positioned on the ground near the wall. Azevedo plans to add more lilies, which will make more than 200 in the park.

A PLACE FOR THE PUPS

Construction on the Chester T Dog Park inside Gene Record will

begin this fall. The designated area will be for dogs to romp, run and play. Chester T is the dog of the late Lynn Ramey, a local resident. Ramey was a true dog lover, according to Teresa King. King is the wife of Mayor Bobby King and one of the organizers of the project. Planning began two years ago.

FUTURE HOME

"Lynn had such a passion for animals; we felt the best way to honor her and the healthy lifestyle the city is trying to promote was to create this park for animals," Teresa said.

Plans for the pet area include waste, feeding and watering stations, exercise area, benches and vaccination and rescue programs. Construction will cost \$15,000 and organizers are waiting on grant funding and are collecting private donations.

"I'm retired, and since our children are grown, our pets are an important part of our lives," Teresa said.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Community support and donations continue to provide new ventures for Gene Record Park. In late 2016, A1 Pools & Spa donated a new drinking fountain. Other donations include the lilies planted throughout the park and a sunshade placed over one of the park's benches. "My guys are really great. If I have an idea, they will figure out a way to make it happen," Azevedo said. Gene Record Park is being equipped with Wi-Fi, joining Henderson's Downtown Park as a hotspot location.

Gene Record Memorial Park opened in May 1993, named after the former mayor who worked to create it. It has soccer fields, a walking trail, a children's play area and pavilions.

Local leaders, residents and Azevedo are leading the charge to keep up the momentum. "We'd like to install lighting, replace older playground equipment, add an amphitheater and a splash pad," Azevedo said. "With more diverse activities, park usage will continue to increase."

CCHS HEALTH COUNCIL

A SUCCESSFUL YEAR INCLUDES A NEW NEST, AWARDS AND COMMUNITY IMPACT

Eagles' Edge is the new home for Chester County High School's Health Council and is 4,500 square feet of space for meetings, team-building activities and inservice training.

"The move is a major upgrade for us," Heather Griffin said. "We have more space than we've ever had, and we'll be able to accommodate our growing council." Griffin is the health and nutrition coordinator for the school system. This spring Griffin won the Coordinator of the Year Award for the Southwest region. Southwest Regional Consultant Annette Wilson nominated Griffin."Heather and her assistant, Amy (Eads), have really done some amazing things with the health council. She coordinates a health fair that serves the entire community. They are rooted in the community, and I'm so impressed by the work they do," Wilson said.

To complete the Eagles' Edge remodel, the Chester County School Board and director of schools, the Henderson/Chester County Chamber of Commerce Leadership Class, Freed-Hardeman University and several local businesses volunteered hours, materials and resources.

"The Eagles' Edge happened because of their trust and support given to us. They were really involved, and we're so appreciative for them," Griffin said.

The new space includes a room for school uniforms to help students in need, a full-size kitchen and a recreational and meeting room with a ping-pong table. Health council member Noah Griffin volunteered during the six-month remodel. "I did some painting and work in the yard," Griffin, a sophomore, said. "It's mind-blowing to see the finished work and how it all progressed."

During the school year, members of the council filmed a video for an anti-tobacco campaign and spread kindness by leaving positive notes around the school and on car windshields. "My favorite thing this year was filming the anti-smoking video and meeting different people," Sam Phillips, a sophomore, said. Senior, Brennan Phelps believes the council's agenda spreads positivity. "I feel like the council helps students feel better about themselves," he said.

The Student Health Council began in 2008 to promote five areas of total personal fitness: mental, physical, social, emotional and spiritual. Students are selected to participate based on teacher recommendations. Eagles' Edge is open 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.
